Sound Scavenger Hunt Listening Activity for Kids

A sounds scavenger hunt is a fun way to get outside and play while also developing your child's listening skills and observation skills!

Sound Hunt Materials Needed:

- paper
- pencils or markers
- clipboard (optional)
- Sound Hunt printable (optional)

How to Set Up a Sound Hunt:

- 1. Go outside in your neighbourhood or to a park/outdoor space.
- 2. Give each child a paper, marker / pencil
- 3. Providing clipboard is optional
- 4. Have everyone find a spot on the grass or somewhere in nature and just listen for what they can hear.

- 5. Younger pre-schoolers/toddlers can work together with an adult or big sibling. Adult can write while the toddler/pre-schooler tells them what they hear.
- 6. Write/draw the things you hear on your paper to create your own hunt page.
